Key Skills Impacted: 1-Make good friend choices, 2-Negotiate conflict, 5-Consider others' perspectives, 6-Self-advocate, 7-Self-regulate emotions, 9-Make responsible, healthy, and ethical choices.

Top Tips for Parents:

- Remember that middle schoolers can't yet think like adults and need guidance.
- Encourage healthy sleep habits (and other forms of selfcare).
- Teach peer negotiation strategies before they're in difficult situations, such as using a code word to contact you for help.
- Encourage them to develop critical thinking though activities such as joining a debate team at high school or writing for a school or trusted local publication.
- Teach media literacy and make distinctions between good and bad news sources.
- Model flexibility in your own thinking when discussing current events.
- Remind them they don't need to do anything or go anywhere that makes them uncomfortable.
- Expect mistakes but maintain high expectations.
- Get them involved in activities that instill a sense of purpose.
- Share times that you succumbed to peer pressure, along with how you regrouped.
- Tell Them to pause and consider possible repercussions before posting anything online.

Conversation Starters:

- "How do you know that's a reliable source?"
- "What do you think would be a reasonable consequence for breaking that rule?"
- "If you want us to rescue you from an uncomfortable situation, what's a code word you could use?"
- "What would you tell a friend who keeps pressuring you to do something you don't want to do?"

What is Read Across America?


Read Across America 2023 is a special day designed to encourage children to enjoy reading. Started in 1998 by the National Educators Association, Read Across America Day seeks to inspire readers about the wonders of reading. It is estimated that 45 million Americans are functionally illiterate, meaning they cannot read above a fifth-grade level. Read Across America seeks to destignatize this issue and inspire children to find the beauty and joy in the pleasure of reading. Evidence shows that children learn 4,000 to 12,000 new words annually if they read regularly. Reading also boosts memory skills and reduces stress, meaning that many skills can be targeted just by picking up a book with your kids. Good literacy skills are linked with children accessing the entire curriculum, helping to benefit their learning across the board. As Dr. Seuss said, "The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go."

Scent Free is our Target

Many are familiar with our concern over food allergies exposure as that has been in our conversations for decades now. In education, we have only recently started talking with our community about the concerns for student health around SCENTS. We have several students here at SMS that have a physical reaction (potentially anaphylactic) to scents in the air. To help protect these students we ask that NO student bring spray perfume, cologne or deodorant to campus. When at home we ask they use any perfume or cologne very sparingly if at all. Please try to select a stick style deodorant for school use.
